The United Nations



- International organization of countries created in 1945 to promote world peace, develop good relations and cooperation between countries, and to encourage respect for human rights
- New members are admitted to the UN on the recommendation of the Security Council by a two-thirds vote of the General Assembly.
- Membership is open to any country that supports the UN's mission and is willing to follow the rules and responsibilities specified in the charter







Adopted by the General Assembly of the United Nations in 1948, the Universal Declaration states basic rights and fundamental freedoms to which all human beings are entitled.

No one has the right to hold you in slavery.

WE ARE ALL BORN FREE AND EQUAL

NO MATTER YOUR RACE, RELIGION OR NATIONALITY

No one has the right to torture you.

You have the right to recognition everywhere as a person before the law.

We are all equal before the law and are entitled to equal protection of the law.
