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


LEARN (l-er-n): means study or know about something.

For example: I **learn** new things at school.










SPELL (s-bel): means write or name the letters of a word

How to **spell** "friend"? F-R-I-E-N-D!

THINK (th-in-k): means have something in mind

For example: Students always think in the classroom!

TEACH (t-e~~~ch): means tell or help someone how to do something

A teacher **teaches** students knowledge!

EXPLAIN (ix-blein): make something clear

For example: Callie doesn't understand what "draw" means, and Pete **explains** to her. Callie now understands what "draw" means.

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DISCUSS (dis-gus): means talking about something with other people

For example: We **discuss** about our favorite books in English class.

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PAINT


PAINT (p-ein-t): draw with colorful paints

BORING (b-or-rin): means not interesting, not fun

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For example: The game is very boring, he doesn't want to do the game anymore.

FRIENDLY (fr-en-dly): means being nice


Tommy is very **friendly**, everyone wants to be friend with him.

RESPECTFUL

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RESPECTFUL (ris-bekt-fol): means showing respect.

When others are speaking, we should not speak. This is called being respectful.











Sarah has a big bag and a small pencil.






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CLEVER (kle-ver): means smart, good at understanding and learning

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LOUD (l-ou-d): means noisy, a lot of sound, not quiet

For example: Kelly reads out the paragraph loud.
