Adjectives are words that describe or modify nouns. They give us more information about the people, places, or things we're talking about.





Excited

[uhk·sai·tuhd]

- Definition: Feeling very happy and enthusiastic about something.
- Example Conversation:

Student 1: "I'm so excited about the school trip next week!"

Student 2: "Me too! I can't wait to see the zoo."



☆ Disappointed

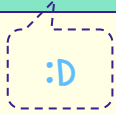
di·suh·poyn·tuhd

- Definition: Feeling sad or let down because something didn't happen the way you expected.
- Example Conversation:

Student 1: "I'm disappointed that it rained during our outdoor playtime."

Student 2: "Yeah, I was looking forward to playing soccer."



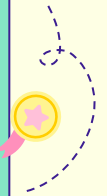
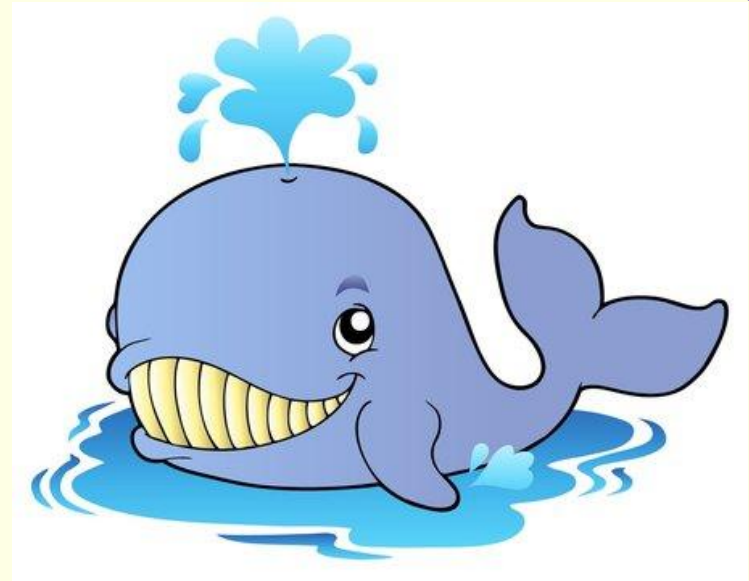


Big

- Definition: Large in size or extent; significant.
- Example Conversation:

Student 1: "Look at the big tree near the playground!"

Student 2: "It's huge! I wonder how old it is."



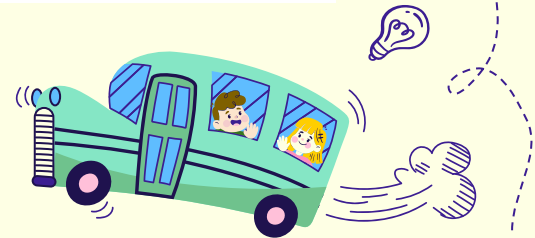



Small

- Definition: Not large in size, amount, or degree; tiny.
- Example Conversation:

Student 1: "I found a small snail on the sidewalk."

Student 2: "It's so tiny! Let's watch it crawl."



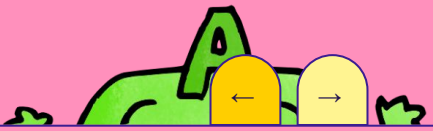
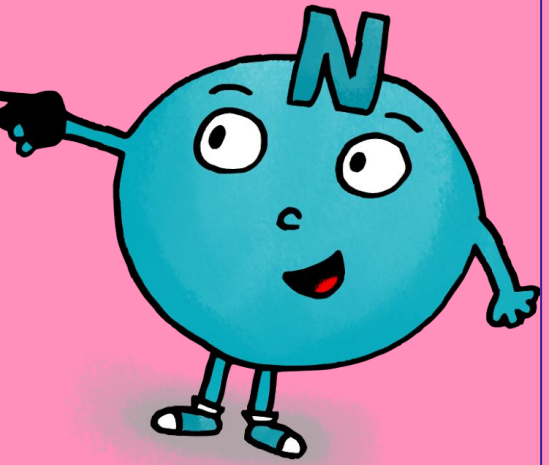
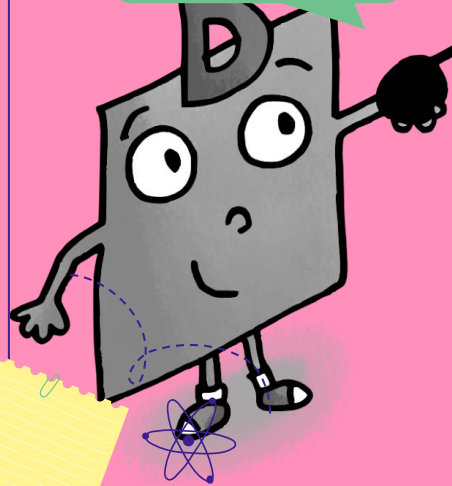

☆ Explore

uhk·splor

- Definition: To investigate or look around carefully in order to learn more about something.
- Example Conversation:

Student 1: "Let's explore the school garden during our science break."

Student 2: "Good idea! Maybe we'll find some cool bugs."



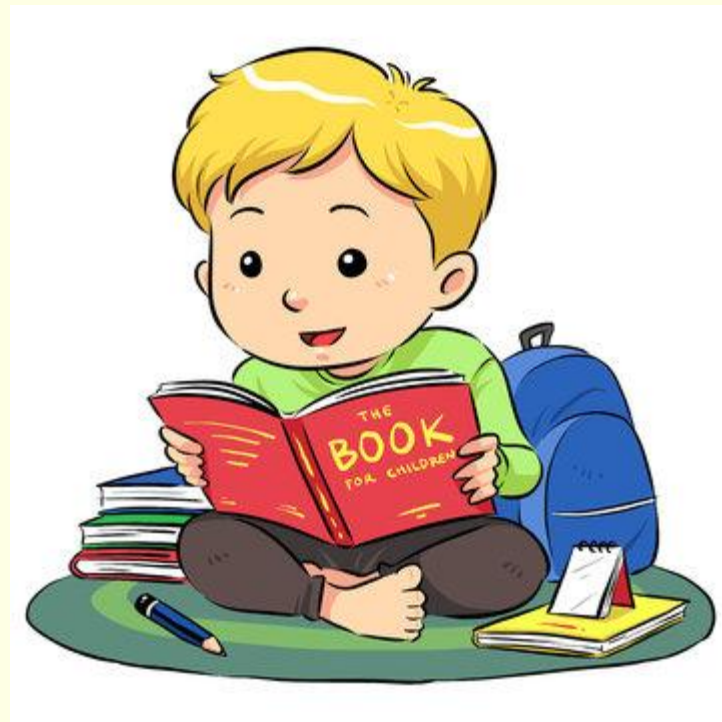


Read

- Definition: To look at and understand the meaning of written words or symbols.
- Example Conversation:

Student 1: "What book are you reading?"

Student 2: "I'm reading a story about a brave knight."





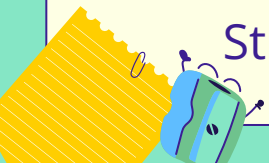
Share

- Definition: To give some of what you have to someone else, or to let someone else use or enjoy something that belongs to you.
- Example Conversation:

Student 1: "Can I share my snack with you?"

Student 2: "Sure, thank you!"





Help

- Definition: To make it easier or possible for someone to do something by offering assistance or support.

- Example Conversation:

Student 1: "I need help with this math problem."

Student 2: "I can help you. Let's solve it together."





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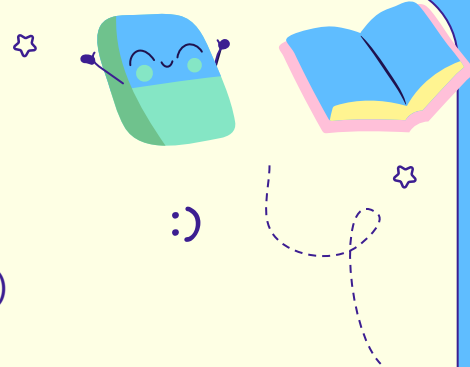
