# What is Slang?



**Definition :** *Slang is informal language used in everyday speech, often among friends.*

Note: Slang changes quickly and can depend on region or age group.



# Popular Everyday Slang



Slang	Meaning	Example Sentence
Dude	Friend/Guy	"Hey, what's up dude!"
Cool	Awesome, Great	"That movie was so cool!"
Chill	Relax/Calm down	"Let's chill at home."
Bummer	Something disappointing	"That's such a bummer.."



# Internet/Gen z Slang



Slang	Meaning	Example Sentence
Cap/No cap	Lie/No lie	"That's cap." "No cap, I'm serious!"
Slay	Do something amazingly	"You slayed that outfit!"
Bet	OK/deal	"You coming?" "Bet"
LOL	Laugh-Out-Loud	"LOL, that's so funny!"





# Phrases for Everyday Conversations



Slang	Meaning	Example Sentence
What's up?	How are you?	"Hey, what's up?"
Long time no see!	Haven't seen you in a while	"Hi grandpa, long time no see!"
Hang out	Spend time together	"You wanna come hang out?"
Catch you later	See you soon	"I got to go, I'll catch you later!"



# Example Conversations:



**Lily:** "Hey, what's up Jack?"

**Jack:** "Not much, just chilling. You?"

**Lily:** "Same. That english test was rough (hard) tho."

**Jack:** "No cap, I totally failed."



# Slang to Avoid

Not all slang is safe for every situation. Some can sound rude, outdated, or inappropriate.



## “Shut up”

Can sound disrespectful or rude



## “Crap”

Mild curse word, not classroom-appropriate



## “Sucks”

Informal; can be offensive in polite settings



\*Try not to use slang in a formal environment (like in emails).
